Editorial

Hello all! My name is Elizabeth Lovejoy, and I'm the Child Sponsorship Coordinator at Nueva Esperanza. I'm very excited to tell you that this autumn newsletter is all about our Child Sponsorship program! Sponsoring a child through our ministry is a great way to partner with us more personally. Even though I've been working here less than a year, it has been incredible to see the impact that sponsors have on the children and families involved with Nueva Esperanza.

My tasks include office work such as tracking sponsorship donations and sending out giving reminders, but I also have the opportunity to work together with children and their sponsors. When teams come to the ministry, I have the pleasure of introducing children to their sponsors and even translating their conversations. When people decide to start sponsoring a child, I put their information packets together and help them set up their giving. If a sponsor sends a designated donation for their child's birthday, I get to give the child their gift and explain who the gift is from. I have been able to see the impact that sponsors have in the relationships they form with their children here. I have even heard children tell me that they love their sponsors and pray for them in their homes! It is such a beautiful picture to see both sponsors and children learn from one another.

A heartbreaking part of what I do is removing children and youth from our program because they stopped coming due to moving away from the ministry, family difficulties, or some other reason. This is followed by having to pass that information along to their sponsors. In those discouraging times, I have to trust that the children learned about the truth of Christ's love and how to live by good values that will help them improve their lives while they were at Nueva Esperanza.

Our child sponsors are vital in helping us run as a ministry. Their donations help us to pay for our teacher's salaries, food for our children, educational materials, building costs, and so much more! Nueva Esperanza is able to provide a safe place where our children can be well taken care of because of donations. To all our child sponsors, thank you for helping us provide for the children's physical needs while also supporting our vision to educate them in the knowledge and love of Christ. Even more than that, thank you for your prayers and for the love you pour into creating impactful relationships with

our children and youth.
